PRODUCT DESCRIPTION AND RECOMMENDED USE: POLY OIL SEAL (WCP #601) An acrylic emulsion used to promote adhesion over gasoline, grease and oil spots or chemical stains prior to the application of asphalt base sealcoat on asphaltic surfaces. Easy to use on a parking lot, residential street, driveway, airport runway, traffic safety island or any asphalt surface.

HOW TO USE: Surface areas to be treated must be free from dirt and dust. Scrape excessive build-up of oil, grease or any other chemical stain spots.

Mix well before using. Use full strength on heavy spots. Reduce 1 to 1 with water, depending on the build-up of the oil, grease or any other chemical stain spots. Sprinkle a slight amount of silica sand on POLY OIL SEAL (#651) to improve adhesion of the sealcoat.

 SUGGESTED RATES (APPROXIMATE): Approximately .10 (1/10) undiluted gallon per square yard to be primed.
